XAVIER BECERRA, in his Official Capacity as Attorney General of the State of California, et al. Defendants. This Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by plaintiff Timothy J. Desmond (Plaintiff) and defendants Attorney General Xavier Becerra, in his official capacity, Secretary of Food and Agriculture Karen Ross, in her official capacity, Branch Chief of the Fairs and Expositions Branch John Quiroz, in his official capacity, and Chief Executive Officer of the 21st District Agricultural Association John Alkire, in his official capacity (collectively, "Defendants" and with Plaintiff, collectively, "the Parties"). Settlement Agreement (1:16-cv-01206-DAD-BAM)

WHEREAS Plaintiff commenced this civil action, *Desmond v. Harris, et al.*, 1:16-cv-01206-DAD-BAM (E.D. Cal.), on August 15, 2016, alleging that: (1) he created a painting called *The Attack*; (2) he was precluded by Defendants from displaying that painting at the 2015 Big Fresno Fair because of defendants' enforcement of California Government Code section 8195, which precludes the State from selling or displaying "the Battle Flag of the Confederacy, also referred to as the Stars and Bars, or any similar image, or tangible personal property, inscribed with such an image unless the image appears in a book, digital medium, or state museum that serves an educational or historical purpose," Cal. Gov't Code § 8195(a); and (3) his First Amendment rights were violated as a consequence; and

WHEREAS Plaintiff alleges that *The Attack* was eligible to be, and should have been displayed, at the 2015 Big Fresno Fair; and

WHEREAS Plaintiff sought relief in this action precluding Defendants from, inter alia, continuing to enforce California Government Code section 8195; and

WHEREAS the parties agree that Section 8195 did not provide a valid justification for precluding *The Attack* from being shown at the 2015 Fresno Fair; and

WHEREAS Defendants have not admitted or acknowledged, and do not admit or acknowledge, any fault, liability, or wrongdoing of any kind and deny the material allegations contained in Plaintiff's Complaint in this action, either in or outside of this Agreement;

WHEREAS Defendants have stated their position on the application of California Government Code section 8195 as set forth in paragraph 2 of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS Plaintiff submitted *The Attack* to the 2016 Big Fresno Fair and it was displayed and judged therein; and

WHEREAS the Parties agree that it is in their collective best interest to settle this matter and avoid further costs and the uncertainties of litigation;

1. Plaintiff will dismiss this action, *Desmond v. Harris, et al.*, 1:16-cv-01206-DAD-BAM (E.D. Cal.), with prejudice.

2. Defendants represent that the following accurately depicts their position with respect to California Government Code section 8195:

It is the position of the Defendants, including the Attorney General, that California Government Code section 8195 applies only to the State of California and not to private individuals. See Cal. Gov't Code § 8195(a). This conclusion derives from the plain language and the legislative history of the statute. Specifically, "the State of California may not sell or display the Battle Flag of the Confederacy, also referred to as the Stars and Bars, or any similar image, or tangible personal property, inscribed with such an image unless the image appears in a book, digital medium, or state museum that serves an educational or historical purpose." Id.

Section 8195 neither affects the rights of private individuals to carry, display, or sell a Confederate Flag or any similar image either on private or government property nor authorizes the government to restrict the display or sale of a Confederate Flag or any similar images, by private individuals in a government forum.

3. Defendants shall be completely released and forever discharged to the fullest extent permitted by law from: (1) the claims, allegations, and causes of action asserted in the Complaint in this action; and (2) any and all claims, allegations, causes of action, and suits that Plaintiff could have brought or hereafter could bring against Defendants (or any of them) based on the facts alleged in the Complaint in this action. Plaintiff waives and relinquishes all rights and benefits conferred by California Civil Code Section 1542, which provides: A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release, which if known by him or her must have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor. Plaintiff also waives any right or benefits afforded by any similar statute or law in California or any other jurisdiction. Nothing in this paragraph should be construed as releasing claims unrelated to the facts alleged in the Complaint.

1	4. The Parties shall bear their own costs and attorneys' fees in connection with this	
2	action and waive any right that they may have to recover from each other costs and attorneys'	
3	fees incurred in this action.
